### Homeless and Hunger Awareness Month

We attended a presentation by Matthew Desmond who spoke on his book *Evicted*. Did you know one eviction notice will follow you for a lifetime and it is very difficult to remove the record even after it has been rectified? Some owners of the worst apartments are charging the highest rents to people who are desperate.



We also co-hosted the game of Rent. This was similar to the game of Life but based on real facts in the Lehigh Valley. This was a very enlightening experience. But what may have made the biggest impact was Night Without a Bed. We thank everyone who participated.

We thank everyone who participated especially Greenawalds who hosted an overnight sleep out. Families slept in tents, cardboard boxes, and cars. Pastor Janet wanted her congregation to experience what it is like to experience homelessness. She hoped the participants would take away some empathy for what the families are going through as well as resources that are available. She stressed how many families are just one crisis away from homelessness. Peyton, age



10, slept in a cardboard box. She was very interested to see how cold it would get. St. Joseph the Worker also participated in Night Without a Bed, raising over \$3,000 for

Family Promise of Lehigh Valley. Our director, Roslyn, slept in her car. She was shocked at how cold it actually got. "It became a big refrigerator", she said. Her toes were freezing even with two pairs of socks and boots. Not to mention the church doors were open so bathroom use was not an issue. The idea that these families have no bathrooms would make the situation so much worse. In addition, at 7 a.m. everyone went into the church to warm up and have some light breakfast. There is no relief for these families in the morning which is something that really stuck with Roslyn.

(Luke 12:48) Charles and Alenda Gardner were quick to respond when asked why they give to Family Promise of Lehigh Valley. "Family Promise provides hope to those in need. We see firsthand the benefits of our support and know the dollars we donate will directly help families in need". Charles and Alenda also have a personal connection to Family Promise. Serving as volunteers for the past 3 years, with Jordan UCC, they help to prepare and serve meals, stay overnight and spend time with the families in our program. They are very optimistic about the future of the families they serve. Family Promise of Lehigh Valley reports that over 80% of the families enrolled in our program graduate to stable housing. Our aftercare program helps families remain financially independent for a year after graduation. Although the success of the program is impressive, the need remains great. According to the latest HUD Point in Time report, family homelessness has increased by 51% in the Lehigh Valley since 2020. Charles and Alenda's daughter Meredith, who is a local realtor, believes this is due to rising rent prices and knows firsthand how hard it is for families to find affordable housing. Area residents for over 30 years, the Gardners, who are also active in other Church missions including Big Brothers/Big Sisters, and the Food Pantry at Jordan, see the number of people in need has been steadily growing. They feel for those in need and want to help. "We are blessed and feel we should help those in need."
